Construction work at Brama Portowa I and II has been completed

The office complex called Brama Portowa, located in the centre of Szczecin at Brama Portowa Square, has been finished. The grand opening of the project will take place on November 8, 2012.

The project consisted of constructing a modern office complex comprising two independent buildings (Brama Portowa I and Brama Portowa II). Brama Portowa I is a six-storey building with an area exceeding 4,500 square meters. Brama Portowa II, on the other hand, is a seven-storey building with a total area of more than 8,000 square meters. Approximately 2,000 square metres of the building groundfloors are occupied by retail and service units. The remaining storeys are dedicated to office spaces. The project makes it possible to divide and arrange individual floors flexibly. In the underground garages there are 58 parking spaces as well as bicycle stands.

The project has been implemented using environmentally friendly solutions which enable application for LEED certification. Brama Portowa I and II is the first commercial project in Szczecin, which is aspiring to LEED certification. In accordance with the sustainable construction rules, the project has been equipped with innovative water and energy saving systems, optimal access to sunlight, waste segregation facilities, and roofing providing protection against the "heat island effect", as well as bicycle parking spaces for the tenants. The additional feature of the complex is its location which offers easy access to main means of public transport.

The project's investor and developer is SwedeCenter, forming part of the Property Division of the Inter IKEA Group, the general contractor services have been provided by Hochtieff Polska, and T33 Architects seated in Gdynia have designed the project.

"We are glad that the efforts of many people led to the creation of buildings which will form part of Szczecin skyline and will define its character. Upon opening of the Brama Portowa complex the town will get approx. 13,000 square meters of modern office and retail space. It constitutes new and comfortable work environment for many residents of Szczecin. I am convinced that the existence of the modern office projects, including Brama Portowa and other office buildings being under construction, will attract companies wishing to start their business in Szczecin. It is a great chance for the town's development" – said Roger Andersson, the Managing Director of SwedeCenter.

"We are happy to hand over to the investor, i.e. SwedeCenter, two Brama Portowa buildings. It is easy to describe each project giving its technical parameters: thus, the execution of the project involved the insertion of almost 11,000 cubic meters of concrete and optimization of design solutions through the introduction of reinforced concrete and post-tensioned concrete ceilings. Owing to this solution we were able to reduce the quantity of reinforcing steel by approx. 300 tons.

Further, the project constituted a great challenge in logistic terms: We realized the project near one of the busiest intersections in Szczecin, during the reconstruction of the latter. It necessitated specific cooperation with the town authorities and subcontractors.
